

# FLOSS Rule Game

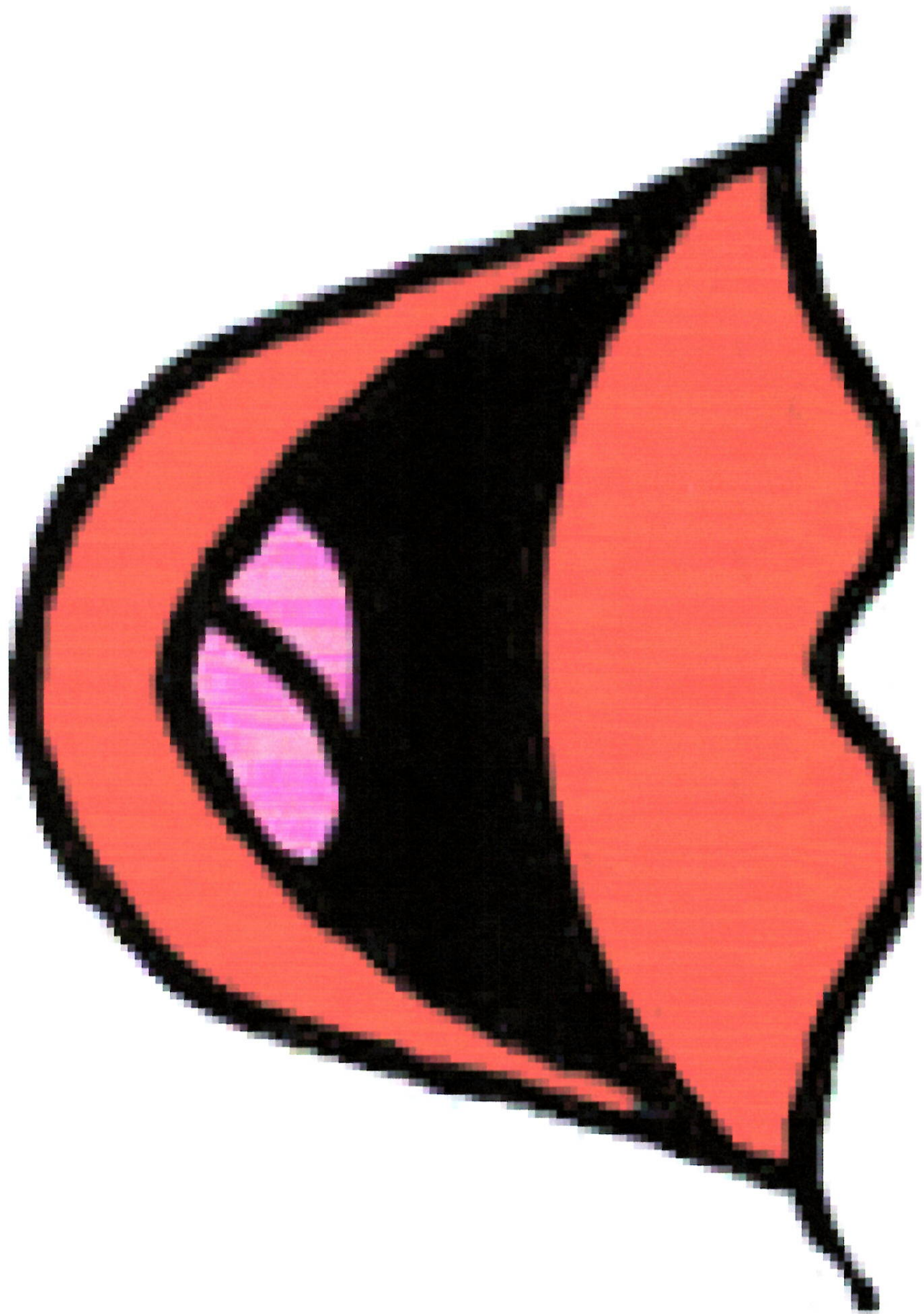


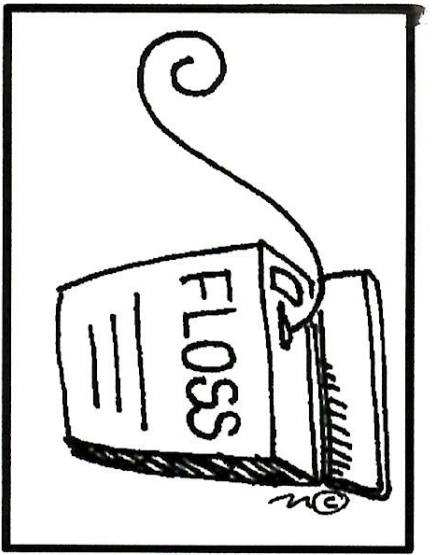
1 S b.w. ñ (f)  ff sniff

(l)  ll hill

(s)  ss pass

In a 1 syllable base word with a short vowel sound ending in (f) is spelled ff as in sniff, ending in (l) is spelled ll as in hill, and ending in (s) is spelled ss as in pass.

# FLOSS Rule Game Instructions

1. Teach students the FLOSS Rule found in the Beginning Level Lesson 20.
2. Make FLOSS Rule File Folder Game.
  - a. Glue FLOSS Rule cover paper on outside front cover of file folder.
  - b. Glue mouth picture to inside top of file folder.
  - c. Cut out pictures of floss and teeth.
  - d. Laminate all pieces.
3. Rules to play FLOSS Rule Game 
  - a. Teacher chooses a word from the word list below. Teacher says the word. Student repeats the word.
  - b. Teacher asks:
    1. Does this word have 1 syllable? If yes, put tooth with "1S" in the mouth.
    2. Is this word a base word? If yes, put tooth with "bw" in the mouth.
    3. Does this word have a short vowel? If yes, put tooth with "v" in the mouth.
    4. Does this word have (f), (l) or (s) in the final position? If yes, put tooth with (f), (l) or (s) in mouth.

If any of the answers are no, then put black tooth in the mouth and say, "Stop! It is too late to floss these teeth. This word does not follow the FLOSS rule."

  - c. If the mouth has all 4 white teeth, then they can be flossed. Put floss picture next to mouth and say, "This word does follow the FLOSS rule. We need to double the final consonant."
  - d. Have students spell the word.
