

Vowel Sounds: [This lesson is to be used after Intermediate Level Lesson 75 to understand vowel sounds in open syllables, closed syllables, vowel consonant e syllables, vowel teams, and final stable syllables.]

Teacher Instructions: Cut up cards. Show students the cards one at a time and have them tell the sound of each vowel and why it makes that sound. Then have students read the word.

cable

a is long because it is in an open syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

pebble

e is short because it is in a closed syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

feeble

vowel team ee is pronounced (ē)
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

nimble

i is short because it is in a closed syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

Bible

i is long because it is in an open syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

cobble

o is short because it is in a closed syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

noble

o is long because it is in an open syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

rumble

u is short because it is in a closed syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

ruble

u is long because it is in an open syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

grape

In an a consonant e syllable, the a is long and the e is silent

ramble

a is short because it is in a closed syllable
e is silent in final stable syllable ble

athlete

a is short because it is in a closed syllable
In an e consonant e syllable, the first e is long and
the final e is silent

five

In an i consonant e syllable, the i is long and the e
is silent

cube

In an u consonant e syllable, the u is long and the e
is silent

stove

In an o consonant e syllable, the o is long and the e
is silent

book

vowel team oo is most often pronounced (oo)
